

## **The rationality of political beliefs**

Recent work in political psychology argues that people's political attitudes are explained by their group identification: political attitudes are expressed to support our alliance and denigrate rivals, and do not express our values. On this view, we do not really believe our own political assertions. I evaluate the plausibility of this account, and present an alternative view, on which political attitudes are genuine beliefs that are rationally acquired.
